21.02.17	Constable	The officer answered allegations that his conduct had breached the Standards of Professional Behaviour of 'Honesty and Integrity', 'Duties and Responsibilities', 'Discreditable Conduct' and 'Orders and Instructions,' by virtue of having been convicted of an offence of driving whilst over the prescribed limit for alcohol and obstructing a police officer in the execution of his duty. It was also alleged that the officer had failed to adhere to force policy, in respect of the storage of CS Spray allocated to him in the course of his duty.	Dismissed without notice
13.03.17	Constable	The officer answered allegations that his conduct had breached the Standards of Professional Behaviour of 'Discreditable Conduct', by virtue of having committed an offence of driving whilst over the prescribed limit for alcohol; the officer was convicted of that offence.	Dismissed without notice
10.05.17	Constable	The officer answered allegations that his conduct had breached the Standards of Professional Behaviour of 'Discreditable Conduct', 'Honesty and Integrity', 'Confidentiality' and 'Authority, Respect and Courtesy' by virtue of him behaving in an inappropriate manner towards a former partner/serving police officer and by accessing police systems for a non-policing purpose.	Dismissed without notice
19.05.17	Constable	The officer answered an allegation that their conduct amounted to a breach of the Standards of Professional Behaviour for 'Discreditable Conduct' by virtue of having been convicted of an offence of driving whilst over the prescribed limit for alcohol.	Dismissed without notice (Special Case Hearing)
03.10.17	Constable	The officer answered allegations that their conduct had breached the Standards of Professional Behaviour of 'Discreditable	Dismissed without notice
