### Your current priorities for this neighbourhood

#### Tackling deliberate fires in the Shirebrook area

Issue was set on 22/01/2016

- ▶ The team will be carrying out high visibility patrols to deter the behaviour and also covert patrols to catch offenders.
- ▶ Officers will be working closely with Bolsover District Council and the fire service to ensure a unified approach and to share any information on offenders.
- ▶ The team will also be liaising with local schools and speaking to youngsters about the dangers of starting fires deliberately.

#### Anti-social behaviour in Shirebrook

Issue was set on 22/01/2016

- ▶ The Shirebrook Safer Neighbourhood Team will be carrying out increased patrols to help to deter anti-social behaviour (ASB) caused by small group of youths in the evening.
- ▶ Officers will be attending local schools to educate the pupils about anti-social behaviour and the affect that it may have on others to deter future incidents.
- ▶ Individuals who are found to be acting in an anti-social manner will be given words of advice and warning letters will be issued where appropriate.
- ▶ The team will be working with partner agencies to consider setting up alternative activities for youngsters in the area.

#### Working to identify houses of multiple occupancy in Shirebrook

Issue was set on 22/01/2016

- ▶ A number of residents raised concerns about the growing number of unofficial houses with multiple occupancies in the town.
- ▶ The Safer Neighbourhood team will be heading out into the community to identify these properties and will be teaming up with partner agencies to offer advice and support. This will include environmental health and the fire service.

### Actions and outcomes from previous priorities

#### Anti-social behaviour on the Model Village and around Collonade Shops

Issue was set on 16/12/2011

- ▶ Increased patrols carried out to deter the problem and arrest offenders.
- ▶ Liaised with the residents to gather information on who is causing the problems and reassure the community we are taking action to put a stop to it.
- ▶ Worked with Bolsover District Council and the CAN Rangers to ensure a unified approach and share any information on offenders.

#### Drug misuse and anti-social behaviour around the Pear Tree estate

Issue was set on 20/09/2012

- ▶ Increased police patrols.
- ▶ Raised awareness of the issue and advised youngsters of the associated risks and dangers of drug misuse.
- ▶ Appropriate action taken against illegal activity where necessary.

### **Drinking and nuisance behaviour, Model Village, Shirebrook**

Issue was set on 14/08/2013

- ▶ Increased police patrols to deter any offenders.
- ▶ Raised awareness of the issue within the local community.
- ▶ Appropriate action taken against any offenders.
- ▶ Liaised with the community to gather information on any persistent offenders or key times.
- ▶ Worked with Bolsover District Council and the CAN Rangers to ensure a unified approach and share any information on offenders.

### **Increased police presence in and around the Market Place, Shirebrook town centre, Shirebrook leisure centre and the Model Village**

Issue was set on 20/05/2014

- ▶ Increased visibility patrols were carried out on the market place on market days, Shirebrook town centre and the Model Village.
- ▶ Enforcement of the Designated Public Place Order (DPPO) was used which bans people from drinking alcohol in public, at the rear of Patchwork Row.
- ▶ Officers carried out patrols of the footpath to the rear of Sookholm Road in relation to damage, littering and suspicious activity.

### **Anti-social behaviour caused by groups gathering in the Model Village area of Shirebrook**

Issue was set on 05/06/2015

- ▶ The Shirebrook Safer Neighbourhood Team carried out increased patrols in the area to help to deter anti-social behaviour (ASB).
- ▶ Officers attended local schools to educate the pupils about anti-social behaviour and the affect that it may have on others to deter future incidents.
- ▶ Individuals who were found to be acting in an anti-social manner were given words of advice and warning letters were also issued where appropriate.

### **Anti-social behaviour caused by groups gathering in the Pear Tree Estate area of Shirebrook**

Issue was set on 05/06/2015

- ▶ Officers carried out increased high visibility patrols in the area to help deter groups of youths from acting anti-socially.
- ▶ Groups were spoken to and advised about their behaviour and the affect that it may have on residents living nearby.
- ▶ Youths who were found to be acting anti-socially were advised and warning letters were issued where appropriate.

### **Underage sales of alcohol in Shirebrook**

Issue was set on 05/06/2015

- ▶ Officers carried out patrols at key times to ensure that no alcohol was being consumed by young people in the area and that any anti-social behaviour was deterred.
- ▶ The team spoke to young people about drinking underage and the affect that it may have on their health and personal safety.
- ▶ Test purchase operations were carried out by police and Trading Standards to ensure that shop and pub staff operated by the Challenge 25 protocol.
