Police are investigating a potential collision in which a man suffered injuries consistent with being struck by a car.

The 22-year-old man admitted himself to Ilkeston Hospital but had no memory of a collision when he arrived.

He was then taken to Royal Derby Hospital. Doctors believe that his injuries - bruising to his ribs and head - were caused by being hit by a car.

The man had been walking along Heanor Road, Ilkeston, near its junction with Shipley Common Lane. He then remembers waking up on the kerb and walking
