I write in connection with your request for information which was received by Derbyshire Constabulary on 11/12/24. I note you seek access to the following information:

I am getting in touch with a Freedom of Information request regarding bleeding kits.

I would like to find out:

- 1. How many bleeding kits (to be used by the public if the situation requires) are in your area?*
- 2. How many have been reported to be used in the past 5 years?*
- 3. Have often do you check the bleeding kits are in date or have not been vandalised?*

Result of Searches

Following receipt of your request, searches were conducted within Derbyshire Constabulary to locate any relevant information. The searches located information relevant to your request.

Decision

I have today decided to disclose the located information to you in full.

Question 1 –

Information held.

Blood kits within Derbyshire were funded and gifted to licensed premises and are managed by the custodian of the kits.

There are currently 56 kits in the High peak and Derbyshire Dales. They are a mixture of council funded kits and those provided within the local communities by charities.

The blood kits were only put into the community in 2023.

The custodians of the blood kits are responsible for the checking of the equipment and were supplied inventory sheets for that purpose. The expiry dates on the kits when they were issued



is 2027. Most kits are within a licensed premises there are only a small amount that are within a public access defibrillator box, which is locked.

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COMPLAINT RIGHTS and COPYRIGHT ISSUES

If you are unhappy with how your request has been handled or you do not think the decision is correct, you have the right to require the Derbyshire Constabulary to review their decision. Prior to lodging a formal complaint you are welcome and encouraged to discuss the decision with the case officer that dealt with your request.

Ask to have the decision looked at again

The quickest and easiest way to have the decision looked at again is to telephone the case officer that is nominated at the end of your decision letter. That person will be able to discuss the decision, explain any issues and assist with any problems.

Complaint

If you are dissatisfied with the handling procedures or the decision that Derbyshire Constabulary have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) regarding access to information, you can lodge a complaint with the Derbyshire Constabulary to have the decision reviewed. **However, this request must be made within 40 working days from the date of our response.**

Where possible the Derbyshire Constabulary will aim to respond to your complaint within 40 working days. However, meeting this time scale will depend upon the circumstances and complexity of the issue.

The Information Commissioner

After lodging a complaint with the Derbyshire Constabulary, if you are still dissatisfied with the decision, you may make an application to the Information Commissioner for a decision on whether the request for information has been dealt with in accordance with the requirements of the Act.
