FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST - REFERENCE NO: 01/FOI/25/007346/S

I write in connection with your request for information which was received by Derbyshire Constabulary on 06/08/2025. I note you seek access to the following information:

Following a July 2025 High Court ruling that Northumbria Police breached impartiality by allowing uniformed officers to march in Newcastle's 2024 Pride parade.

The ruling has prompted a broader revaluation of police participation in such events to maintain impartiality.

Northumbria Police: Following the High Court ruling, Northumbria Police confirmed that officers would not attend the 2025 Northern Pride march in uniform, and all Pride, Progress, or transgender symbols were removed from police vehicles and displays at the event.

Police Scotland: Police Scotland decided that no uniformed officers would march in Glasgow's 2025 Pride event, a shift from the previous year when officers were paid to participate. This decision was influenced by the Northumbria ruling, though plans for minor engagement were already being scaled back prior to the judgment.

North Yorkshire Police: Chief Constable Tim Forber announced that uniformed officers would no longer participate in Pride events, with only those actively policing the events allowed to wear uniforms. This policy change was driven by the High Court ruling and Forber's appointment in April 2024.

Sussex Police: A post on X indicated that Sussex Police confirmed they would not participate in the 2025 Brighton & Hove Pride parade, though no further details were provided in the web sources to confirm the extent of this withdrawal.

Given the evolving nature of this issue, additional forces may have made similar decisions that are not yet widely reported.

Question 1 –

Can you inform me of Derbyshires Chief Constable's decision in regards to attending any future Pride events in an official capacity.

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COMPLAINT RIGHTS and COPYRIGHT ISSUES

Complaint

If you are dissatisfied with the handling procedures or the decision that Derbyshire Constabulary have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act) regarding access to information, you can lodge a complaint with the Derbyshire Constabulary to have the decision reviewed. **However, this request must be made within 40 working days from the date of our response.**

Where possible the Derbyshire Constabulary will aim to respond to your complaint within 20 working days. However, meeting this time scale will depend upon the circumstances and complexity of the issue.

The Information Commissioner

After lodging a complaint with the Derbyshire Constabulary, if you are still dissatisfied with the decision, you may make an application to the Information Commissioner for a decision on whether the request for information has been dealt with in accordance with the requirements of the Act.
